


## A Happy Tail: Ralphie


"The minute she comes home, he runs to her. He lays on her and purrs 24/7 with her. ... He sleeps on her chest every night. They are best friends!"





You could say that Anne Burnett has fostering and volunteering down to a science ... or is it an art? She has been an integral part of Whiskers TNR since 2017, known for her creativity and versatility.

"Thank you, Anne, for your constant display of compassion for the animals," said Whiskers founder Corissa Arndt. "I admire your creativity and your eagerness to help in any way possible."

Burnett has fostered, served on the Whiskers board of directors, coordinated the spay/neuter of outdoor cats, and organized a cat shelter building event -- often with her family pitching in. And those ultra-adorable pics of our adoptable kitties? Burnett's handiwork as Whiskers TNR's official photographer.

Burnett approaches the other aspects of life with

equal flair, a musician, world traveler and professional photographer along with her husband. Her part-time day job is at the Iowa Utility Association, a nonprofit in the East Village.

### 2 months, 2 pounds: Time 2 spay and neuter

It's a phenomenon we see all too often here at Whiskers TNR: a mama cat who is so young that she's technically still a kitten herself!

A way to prevent this? Remember this rule of thumb: 2 months, 2 pounds = time to spay and neuter. According to our friends at Alley Cat Allies, not only does this prevent pregnancy in kittens as young as four months old, kittens recover quicker from the surgery.
