Richey has been named Whiskers TNR's "Whiskers Warrior," its volunteer of the month, for September.

"Angie is committed to giving. She has been a wonderful addition to the Whiskers fosters/volunteers and is always willing to help," said Rhodes, Whiskers TNR's volunteer coordinator. "She also inspires her kids to give back to the community at such a young age."

In fact, when Richey first connected with Whiskers in August 2022, it was with her husband, Matt, and their kids, Molly and John, in tow. The family had been checking out "Caturday," when Whiskers volunteers bring adoptables to Norwalk Easter Public Library once a month.

Richey filled out an application to volunteer and, as it happened, Whiskers organizers were looking for someone to help clean their new holding facility in Prole.

"When I called Angie to walk through her application, I remember saying, 'How do you feel about cleaning toilets?' That was the beginning of a great relationship," Rhodes said, laughing.

In fact, Richey and her family now takes in cats and kittens in addition to their cleaning duties.

"I love snuggling kittens, but I really like the feeling that I'm contributing to such a worthy cause," she said of her favorite aspect of volunteering. "Molly helps me clean the Whiskers building on Saturday mornings, and John helps take care of the foster kittens in our home."

When Richey isn't volunteering, she can be found at her day job as a supervision analyst at a broker dealer, curling up with a good book, or exploring the great outdoors courtesy of Warren County Conservation's geocaches, which she described as "like a treasure hunt to find a hidden 'cache'" in area parks.

And in the midst of fostering, the Richeys found another kind of unexpected treasure: a cat they couldn't bear the part with, a gray, timid beauty named Sheba. They hadn't planned to adopt but formed a unique bond with her while working to gain her trust.

"Sheba is our foster-to-forever girl," Richey said. "She's extremely awkward but so sweet, and we all love her so much."

It's that kind of dedication and bigheartedness that Richey shows every day, said Rhodes, whether she's sporting cleaning gloves or a foster kitten in her arms.

"Angie, thank you for being so open-minded for helping get the dirty work done," Rhodes said. "You opened your home and your heart to being vulnerable to foster and have taken on some really tricky cases. Whiskers is grateful for everything you do."
